THIRST PROJECT



- → Key Club Official Partner
- → Thirst Project is a nonprofit organization that works with the support of young people to END the **global water crisis** by building freshwater wells in developing communities that need safe, clean drinking water.





Women and children travel an average of **3.75 miles** and spend an average of **six to eight hours** each day walking to fetch water. The time children spend collecting water keeps them from going to school and getting an education.

Providing a community with safe drinking water can lower disease rates by up to 88% virtually overnight! Additionally, child mortality rates can drop up to 90%!




ERIKA'S LIGHTHOUSE

This nonprofit organization encourages good mental health and strives to **break down the stigma** surrounding mental health issues. The mission of Erika's Lighthouse is to make sure **no young person feels alone** in their depression.





Adolescent depression and anxiety live in the shadows. Young people facing it feel **isolated** and dangerously alone. Globally, it is estimated that **1 in 7** (14%) of 10-19 year-olds experience mental health conditions, yet these remain largely unrecognized and untreated.



Erika's Lighthouse helps schools provide their students with the **skills** needed to talk to each other, to their parents, to their teachers and to counselors. Their resources raise awareness, **reduce stigma**, educate students, promote good **mental health** and encourage **help-seeking**.

MARCH OF DIMES



March of Dimes works to improve the health of babies by preventing birth defects, premature birth, and infant mortality.





Premature birth and its complications are the #1 cause of death of babies in the United States. Babies who survive premature birth and its complications often have long-term health problems, including cerebral palsy, intellectual disabilities, chronic lung disease, blindness and hearing loss.



The March of Dimes carries out their mission to save babies' lives through research, community services, education, and advocacy.

CHILDREN'S MIRACLE NETWORK



Children's Miracle Network's mission is to increase funds and awareness for Children's Miracle Network hospitals to **save** and improve the lives of as many children as possible.





Children's Miracle Network Hospitals is a nonprofit organization that raises funds for children's hospitals in the U.S. and Canada that support the health of **10** million children each year across the U.S. and Canada.
