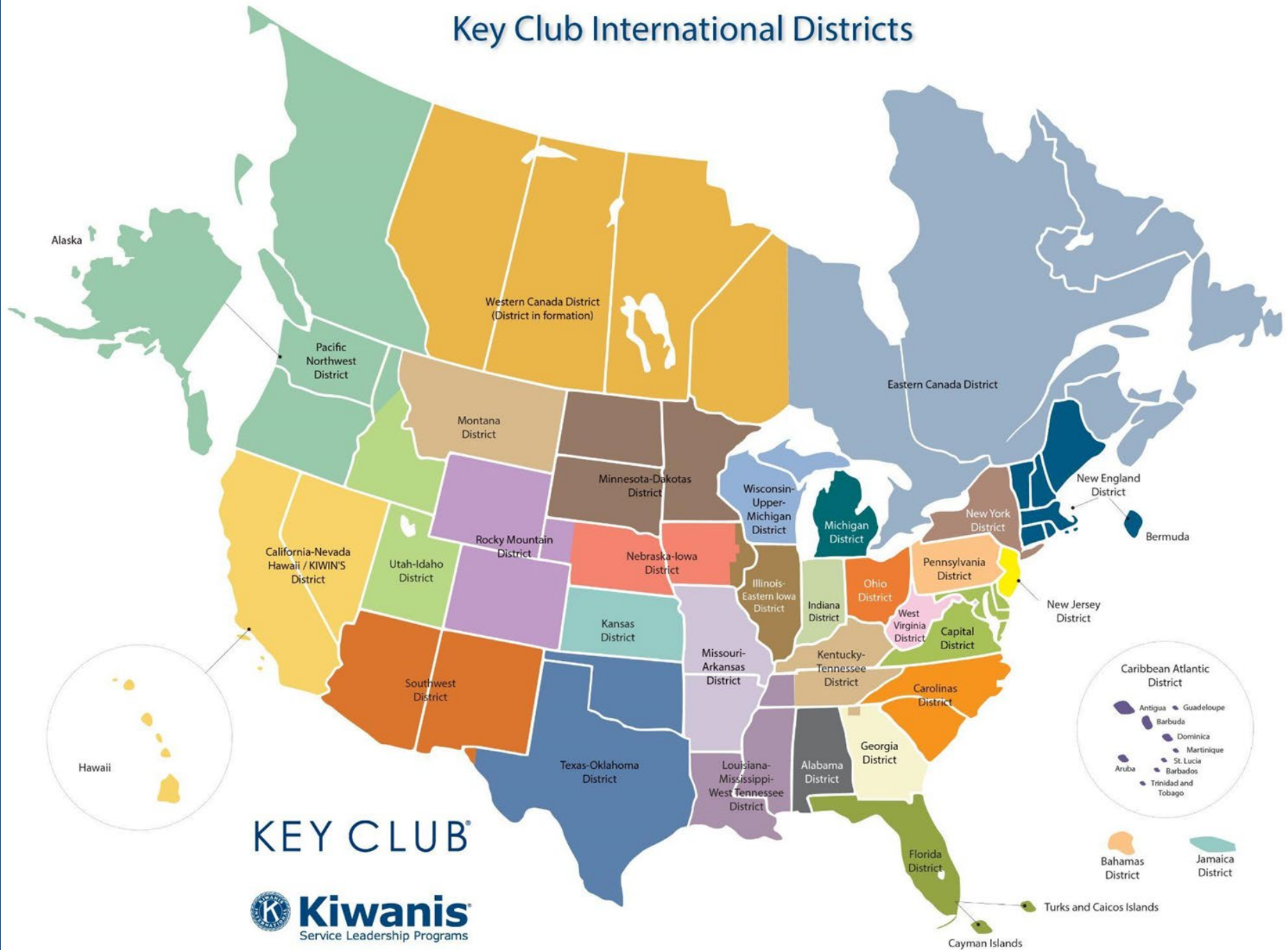

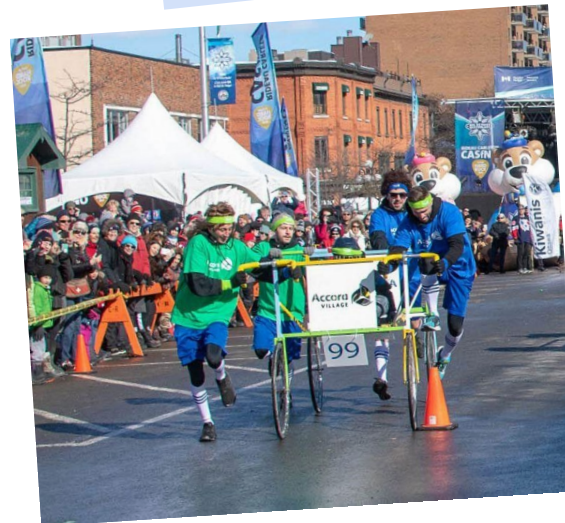
# Colombia ~ Christmas Gift

This is an event that **Key Club AIS** has been doing for the last **2 years**. In which we fundraise presents to gift on **Christmas** to vulnerable kids and do a social immersion. Where we are working to achieve the SDGs #1 and #10



# Eastern Canada District ~ Ottawa Bed Race

This is an event where teams register and **collect funds to compete in a race in which they push a bed on wheels across Dow's lake on the Rideau Canal in Ottawa.** It's a truly unique fundraiser that funds the Ottawa clubs service projects for the year!



# Indiana District ~ KCGT

**KCGT is a virtual talent show telethon with a mission to raise money for Riley Hospital for Children.**

The LTGs contact local businesses and Kiwanis clubs asking for sponsorships for the event, and advertised during the event based on their donation. Then the day of the telethon, a six hour livestream is broadcasted. There are multiple speakers, games, ect.

This year the event raised nearly \$17,000; surpassing the goal of \$15,000.





# Illinois-Eastern Iowa District ~Sorting Crayons for SCARCE

As a September Divisional Service Project, the I-I District's Division 9 East got together to peel and sort crayons for SCARCE. **The organization has a local building where they accept donations of crayons and other materials and then repurpose them to help other people.** The Division LTG, Emily Fujiwara, contacted the leader at the facility and she had suggested that they sort the crayons because it is an easier task but still allows for people to get involved and help a good cause.

Overall, the project was super simple to set up, but very impactful for the community and resulted in an amazing success for not only the Division, but also the District!



# New Jersey District ~ Clothing Drive

In order to further our district project, which is “Keeping the Garden State Green,” the New Jersey District Board held a **district-wide clothing drive at Fall Rally!** This drive was the perfect opportunity for us to help out our community. When the Key Clubbers arrived at Six Flags with a sealed bag or box full of gently-used clothing items, and our team collected them. All donations were sent to those in need.



# Kansas District ~ Drive by Raking

The Kansas District has an event called **Drive by Raking**. Key Clubbers do random acts of kindness for elderly neighbors! They help them rake leaves and tidy up!





# Pacific Northwest District ~ Hope Festival

The Eastlake Key Club in the Pacific Northwest District has received the YOF grant for the past few years and they partner with Hope Fest in Sammamish near Seattle to perform a huge day of service. This past August, they were able to host a summer edition of the festival and serve over 650 individuals with the help of 400 youth volunteers.
